An outstanding clinician and accomplished researcher, Dr. Robert Burakoff has particular expertise in inflammatory bowel disease. Dr. Burakoff's translational research seeks to identify biological markers to differentiate Crohn's disease from ulcerative colitis, as well as determine disease severity and response to therapy. His research also focuses on the role of inflammation in esophageal disorders, including gastroesophageal reflux disease.

Dr. Burakoff chairs the Editorial Board of the National Scientific Advisory Cabinet of the Crohn's and Colitis Foundation of America (CCFA). In 2011, the CCFA honored him as Humanitarian of the Year for his care of patients with IBD. He is a Founding Editor and former Co-Editor-in-Chief of *Inflammatory Bowel Diseases*, the first journal devoted to the study of basic and clinical science in IBD, and the current Editor-in-Chief of *Scientific American Gastroenterology*, *Hepatology and Endoscopy*.

Dr. Burakoff's distinguished career includes the development of centers of excellence in digestive health and programs in GI motility, liver disease, and pancreatico-biliary disease. For the past 14 years, Dr. Burakoff served as Clinical Chief of the Division of Gastroenterology and Director of the Center for Digestive Health at Brigham and Women's Hospital and as Professor of Medicine at Harvard Medical School.
