Tobacco Cessation Awareness Month

November 16th is the Great American Smoke-Out, a day designated to support the efforts of tobacco users who are ready to take a step toward quitting. While each person's struggle with tobacco is unique, this day reminds us that we all have a stake in helping our friends, families, clients, team members, and co-workers find sustainable ways to lead a tobacco-free life.

Department of Health Public Comment Session for New York's 1115 Waiver programs

The Department of Health will be convening a Public Comment session for New York's 1115 Waiver programs on November 16th at the New York Academy of Medicine, Reading Room, 1216 5th Ave, New York, NY 10029. The Delivery System Reform Incentive Payment (DSRIP) program is a significant waiver initiative, and members of the DSRIP Project Approval and Oversight Panel (PAOP) will join DOH staff in listening to the feedback provided by members of the public and stakeholders. Feedback on all waiver programs is welcomed.

The DSRIP Project Approval and Oversight Panel (PAOP) will convene in the morning for a working session 9:30 am - 12 pm, and MRT 1115 Waiver Public Comment will be conducted from 1:00 pm - 4:00 pm. Any updates related to the forum will be sent via the MRT Listserv. Any written public comment may be submitted through November 29th to 1115waivers@health.ny.gov. Please include "1115 Public Forum Comment" in the subject line.

These meetings will be webcast live and will be open to the public. No preregistration is required. Individuals who wish to provide comment will be asked to register on site by 2pm, and will speak in their order of registration.
